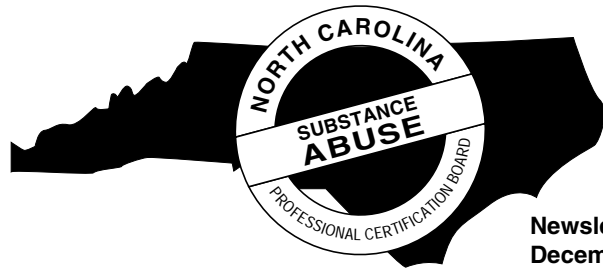

Jim Scarborough Re-elected President of IC&RC/AODA

David Turpin Re-elected Regional IC&RC Chair

On Friday, October 24, 2003, Jim Scarborough, Executive Director of the North Carolina Substance Abuse Professional Certification Board, was re-elected President of the International Certification & Reciprocity Consortium/Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse. This re-election, which was by acclamation, took place at the Fall Annual Meeting of the IC&RC held in Toronto, Canada. This term of office will last for two years and will be his last, as the IC&RC limits its officers to two two-year terms. IC&RC is the multi-national body that develops standards for substance abuse credentialing. IC&RC member boards are found in most states and territories of the United States, the U.S. military, the U.S. Indian Health Services, the World Federation of Therapeutic Communities, and fifteen foreign countries in North and Central America, Europe, the Middle East and Asia. Newest among those non-U.S. boards was the addition of the certification board from Costa Rica at the Toronto meeting.

Speaking after the meeting, Scarborough said, "Re-election by acclamation was something I never anticipated and I am deeply honored by the director's trust in me." Scarborough, who has been an activist President, identifies as the chief accomplishment of his first term the elimination of external testing vendors and the hiring of a full-time psychometrician. "This is a move I consider to be a monumental step forward for IC&RC. The directors and the leadership of IC&RC see this as the beginning of a new era for the organization and all of us are excited about the possibilities this will bring."

Looking forward to the next two years, there is a wide-range of both internal and external steps the organization will likely take. Initiatives such as improving test security, expanding the IC&RC's presence both in the United States and abroad, establishment of a Foundation on research and education initiatives and looking at the possibility of affiliate membership for fraternal organizations interested in certification are but a few of Scarborough's goals in this next term.

"I particularly want to thank the members of the North Carolina Substance Abuse Professional Certification Board

and all the certified professionals in the state who have given me the encouragement to run for this office," Jim said. "I could not possibly accomplish the work I have been elected to do without the support of so many dedicated professionals. Thank you for your trust in me."

Jim serves as President with officers Laura Horton of Indiana (Vice President), John Barlow of Arkansas (Secretary), Rich Bowe of New Jersey (Treasurer) and Administrator's Representative Jane Furtner of Georgia. Upon his re-election, Jim re-appointed former NC Board president and member Flay Lee as Program Committee Chair. Rounding out the IC&RC Executive Committee are Jeff Wilbee, Marketing Committee Chair (Canada), Joanne Dill, Business Operations Committee Chair (Bermuda) and Kristie Schmiege, Finance Committee Chair (Michigan).

Also re-elected this year to a second, two-year term as Regional Chair was David Turpin, longtime member of the North Carolina Substance Abuse Professional Certification Board. "Turp" has served as chair of Region Four, composed of 14 IC&RC member boards including the southeastern states and other jurisdictional and foreign boards. Serving with him as Co-Chair of the Region is Ms. Pam Rush of the South Carolina Prevention Certification Board. "I have seen tremendous growth in IC&RC in these past two years. IC&RC is a stronger, more visible organization than at any time in its history," David said. "I look forward to what is to come with a lot of excitement and I thank the representatives of our regional boards for re-electing me to a second term."

Procedures For Filing An Ethical Complaint

For any individual who believes an ethical violation has occurred, the following steps must be taken:

Initiation:

Any individual with personal knowledge that any person has violated the Code of Ethics, any other rules of the North Carolina Substance Abuse Professional Certification Board, or the statute authorizing the work of this Board (GS 90, Article 5C) may file a complaint against the substance abuse professional by submitting a written complaint on proper Board forms addressed to the Chair of the Ethics Committee.

Form:

The complaint, stating the nature of the alleged offense and signed by the complainant (the person who makes the complaint), shall include:

1. the name, address, and telephone number of the complainant;
2. the name, address, and telephone number of the person against whom the complaint is made (respondent);
3. a statement of the facts which clearly and accurately describes the allegations against the person.

Investigation:

The complaint shall be investigated as set out in the North Carolina Administrative Code.

In further review of the statute, it appears as though the persons who were grandparented into the CCAS with less than a master's degree may also sign the Letters of Reference and that only the CSAC's must also hold a master's degree.
