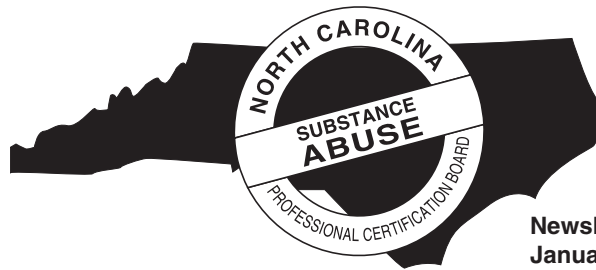

## New International Organization Formed To Promote Credentialing And Standards Of Care In Addiction Treatment And Prevention

### Jim Scarborough Named Inaugural Chair Of New Foundation

In November 2004 the Society of Credentialed Addiction Professionals (S-CAP) [www.addictionsociety.org](http://www.addictionsociety.org) announced its launch as a new international membership organization to promote credentialing of health care professionals in addiction treatment and prevention. No other organization currently exists that focuses exclusively on promotion of credentialing for this internationally expanding group of health care providers.

Since the late 1980s, 40,000 alcohol and other drug abuse treatment and prevention professionals have been certified in the United States and other countries through the leading international addiction treatment and prevention certification body, the International Certification & Reciprocity Consortium/Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse (IC&RC) ([www.addictionboards.org](http://www.addictionboards.org)), the sister organization of the Society. Worldwide, the IC&RC certifies an additional 6,000 to 8,000 professionals annually. For the first time this international group of credentialed addiction professionals will be represented by a professional organization, the Society of Credentialed Addiction Professionals.

“Just within the United States alone it has been estimated that over 21 million individuals are in need of addiction counseling and treatment,” said Jim Scarborough, Chair of the Society. “The vast majority—it has been estimated at less than 10%—receive the care they need. This underscores the important role that our certified professionals play.”

“As the numbers suggest, in our country alone there is an escalating need for addiction specialists who are certified. Internationally the situation is becoming quite alarming,” said Scarborough. “It is imperative that standards of care be promoted in this rapidly developing field of health care for both the treatment of persons suffering from addiction and in the prevention of those behaviors and circumstances that lead to addiction.”

Credentialed addiction specialists are recognized by the ICRC in five specialty areas: alcohol and drugs; advanced alcohol and drugs/co-occurring disorders; prevention; criminal justice and clinical supervision. Other organizations creden-

tial addiction specialists in fields such as medicine, social work and psychology, although in much smaller numbers and as a subspecialty. The work of these organizations is also crucial to winning the international battle against addiction and the Society plans to partner with them in its efforts.

The unique mission of the Society is to ensure quality of care in the prevention and treatment of addictions by internationally promoting certification, licensure and continuing education for

addiction professionals. Institutional members will include certification bodies and other organizations committed to credentialing of addiction professionals. Individual membership is composed of certified addiction professionals, individuals who are seeking certification or those individuals who administer those credentialing programs. The mission of the Society complements the missions of other U.S. and international professional organizations within the addictions field.

The Society’s programs are focused on U.S. and international certification and licensure issues. They include:

- Professional education programs to prepare individuals for addiction treatment and prevention certification and licensure;
- Continuing education programs to prepare these professionals for certification and licensure renewal;

Each year all certified professionals have the opportunity to nominate persons to run for seats on the NCSAPCB. All persons nominated must hold one of the Board's certifications, must be nominated by a person certified by the NCSAPCB (self nomination is acceptable) and must live in North Carolina. Next year's calendar is as follows:

The fee was increased from \$50.00 to \$100.00. Please remember that the fee for a DMV Evaluation DID NOT increase at the same time. That fee remains at \$65.00.
