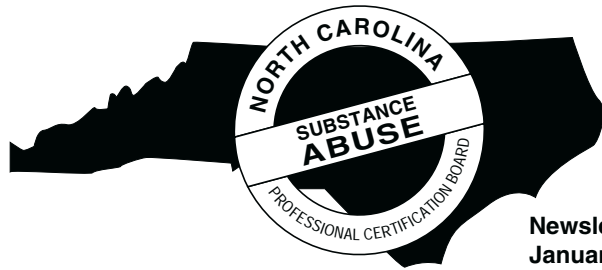

UNC Health Care has an opening for a part-time (20 hours/week) Social Worker in substance abuse for its Trauma Program. As a Level I Trauma Center, goal is to develop the capabilities to evaluate and provide counseling for trauma patients with alcohol or substance abuse problems during their inpatient hospitalization. Expansion of the Alcohol and Substance Abuse Program will assist in the identification of those patients who need assistance, begin to educate this high risk group and provide referrals and counseling in order to decrease the chance for re-injury. Requires interfacing with physicians, families, nurses and various local, regional and state mental health organizations and facilities.

Procedures For Filing An Ethical Complaint

For any individual who believes an ethical violation has occurred, the following steps must be taken:

Initiation:

Any individual with personal knowledge that any person has violated the Code of Ethics, any other rules of the North Carolina Substance Abuse Professional Certification Board, or the statute authorizing the work of this Board (GS 90, Article 5C) may file a complaint against the substance abuse professional by submitting a written complaint addressed to the Chair of the Ethics Committee.

Form:

The complaint shall be in writing, stating the nature of the alleged offense and signed by the complainant (the person who makes the complaint) and shall include:

1. the name, address, and telephone number of the complainant;
2. the name, address, and telephone number of the person against whom the complaint is made (respondent);
3. a statement of the facts which clearly and accurately describes the allegations against the person.

Investigation:

The complaint shall be investigated as set out in the North Carolina Administrative Code.
