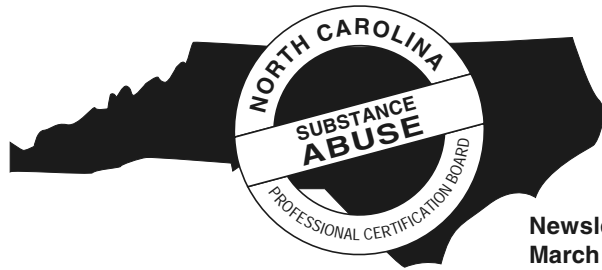

DMV Evaluator Class Scheduled for June

An additional DMV Evaluator Class has been scheduled for Saturday, June 12, 2004 at the Ramada Inn in Burlington, North Carolina. This class is for both retraining and for training of first time evaluators if you have never attended a DMV Evaluator Training Class but would like to be placed on the list to perform this service.

As all evaluators know, retraining every two years is now required by the North Carolina Division of Motor Vehicles in order to maintain one's status as an active evaluator. Two retrainings were held in 2003, one in June and one in September. However, the September training and retraining was scheduled the weekend after Hurricane Isabel and a number of people who were scheduled to attend were unable to be present due to issues related to the aftermath of the storm. Many persons asked DMV for another opportunity to retrain and that is the reason for this training.

Please note: If you did retrain in June or September 2003, it is not necessary for you to retrain. This is just rescheduling. The next major retraining will be held in mid to late 2005.

Registration for the class will begin at 9:00 a.m. that morning with the class beginning at 10:00 a.m. The training will conclude by 1:00 p.m. If you wish to attend, please contact the NCSAPCB office at 919-832-0975 to be placed on the list. Class size is not limited so everyone who registers will be eligible to attend.

Announcement

Previously, the Board has required that signatures on the Letters of Reference for the Certified Clinical Addictions Specialist be from persons who hold both a master's degree and a CSAC or CCAS. In further review of the statute, it appears as though the persons who were grandparented into the CCAS with less than a master's degree may also sign the Letters of Reference and that only the CSAC's must also hold a master's degree. The Board hopes this is of help to persons completing their application packets.

Procedures For Filing An Ethical Complaint

For any individual who believes an ethical violation has occurred, the following steps must be taken:

Initiation:

Any individual with personal knowledge that any person has violated the Code of Ethics, any other rules of the North Carolina Substance Abuse Professional Certification Board, or the statute authorizing the work of this Board (GS 90, Article 5C) may file a complaint against the substance abuse professional by submitting a written complaint on proper Board forms addressed to the Chair of the Ethics Committee.

Form:

The complaint, stating the nature of the alleged offense and signed by the complainant (the person who makes the complaint), shall include:

1. the name, address, and telephone number of the complainant;
2. the name, address, and telephone number of the person against whom the complaint is made (respondent);
3. a statement of the facts which clearly and accurately describes the allegations against the person.

Investigation:

The complaint shall be investigated as set out in the North Carolina Administrative Code.
