



SBI Fingerprint Rejection Policy

According to Wendy L. Brinkley, Special Agent in Charge, Criminal Information and Identification Section of the State Bureau of Investigation (SBI), the quality of fingerprint (ten print) images has decreased in the last few years. This is frequently the result of poor rolling practices as opposed to poor image scanning. Poor quality fingerprint images result in decreased identifications for both ten print and latent searches.

For these records to be searched by both state and federal agencies, fingerprints must be rolled from the tip of the finger to below the first joint and from nail end to nail end. Ridge characteristics must be distinct and fingerprint impressions must be in sequential order.

An image that provides sufficient ridge detail to accurately identify and locate principal fingerprint characteristics include minutiae, cores, deltas and ridges. The following fingerprint rejection policy went into effect February 2, 2004 and was revised June 15, 2006.

1. All law enforcement agencies and non-criminal justice agencies should strive to submit fingerprints that are of good quality.
2. Every criminal and applicant/fingerprint card must have all ten fingerprint images of good quality. The ten print images of the plain impressions/slaps must be completely discernible, thereby allowing comparison between the plain and rolled impressions. NOTE: If a fingerprint in the plain impressions has been cut off (either too low or too high), the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and the SBI cannot compare the rolled images to plain images and will reject the card.
3. Fingerprint cards submitted with the following will be rejected:
 - a. Hands out of sequence
 - b. Fingerprints out of sequence
 - c. Hand printed twice
 - d. Fingerprints printed twice
 - e. Fingerprint missing with no reason given

The exception to this is amputated, bandaged or deformed fingers. If one of these three notations is in a rolled impression block, there should be no fingerprint in the plain impression/slaps. If a fingerprint is in the plain with one of the three notations, the fingerprint card will be rejected from the SBI and the FBI.

The caliber of a fingerprint search/background check depends on the quality of the fingerprint images submitted and/or retained by the SBI. Fingerprint images submitted for employment or licensing purposes are not retained in the SBI fingerprint database. The FBI has informed the SBI that our rejection rate statistics are high and must be improved. To do so, all of us must work together to improve the quality of submissions to the SBI's Criminal Information and Identification Section. Law enforcement and non-criminal justice agencies such as the North Carolina Substance Abuse Professional Practice Board rely on this information to protect the citizens of the State of North Carolina as do any other state, national and federal agencies in their efforts.

DWI Assessment Fee And DMV Evaluation Fee

Last year the North Carolina General Assembly approved an increase in the amount of the fee for a DWI Assessment (commonly referred to as a “508” form). The fee was increased from \$50.00 to \$100.00. Please remember that the fee for a DMV Evaluation DID NOT increase at the same time. That fee remains at \$65.00.

US DOT SAP Providers

Recently the United States Department of Transportation required that anyone who performs US DOT assessments must have completed a course of study on DOT guidelines and passed a national examination in addition to being credentialed with various groups (IC&RC member boards, NAADAC, EAPA). Mr. Herring and Mr. Greene were re-elected to second terms. Mr. Smith was elected to his first term succeeding board member Leslie McCrory who declined a second term. This year, for the first time, newly elected or appointed board members serve for four years. This is a change that occurred last year when the board's practice act legislation passed the General Assembly.

One ballot the board received had a notation on it that said "certainly there must be more qualified people who could be nominated." While that's true, the only people on the ballot are those nominated by the other certified and licensed professionals. "When people say to me, 'why aren't there more people on the ballot,' I say to them 'why aren't you running,'" said Jim Scarborough, executive director of the board.

The board also received two appointments in this year's legislative appointments bill. Appointed for a second term by Senator Marc Basnight, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, was David Turpin. Also appointed by Representative Jim Black, Speaker of the House of Representatives, was Reverend Richard Henderson. Reverend Henderson will take the seat previously occupied by Dr. Geri Miller of Appalachian State University in Boone. Dr. Miller had completed two terms and was ineligible to serve another term without being off the board for at least a year.
