

DO I QUALIFY?

Any Licensed Clinical Addiction Specialist* interested in pursuing the supervision of persons providing substance use disorder services may apply. The CCS is not a standalone credential.

*Applicant must have a human services master's degree with a clinical internship. Grandfathered LCAS's may not apply for CCS.

SCOPE OF PRACTICE

The practice of a certified clinical supervisor is based on knowledge in the performance domains to supervise substance use disorder professionals who work to treat, prevent, or reduce the conditions that place individuals at risk of developing addictive disorder or disease and help prevent relapse. 1. REGISTRATION / CSI

This is the first step in the credentialing process. You must first submit the items for registration.

Registration for CSI is limited to **3 years**, after which an applicant must re-apply.

REQUIRED FOR REGISTRATION:

- DOCUMENTATION OF ADVANCED DEGREE, INCLUDING CLINICAL INTERNSHIP AS PART OF CURRICULA
- SUPERVISION AGREEMENT WITH A CSI
- AGREEMENT TO THE ETHICAL PRINCIPLES OF CONDUCT
- RESUME AND JOB DESCRIPTION
- DOCUMENTATION OF 15 HOURS OF CLINICAL SUPERVISOR SPECIFIC EDUCATION/TRAINING
- REGISTRATION FEE
- COMPLETION OF THE LIVESCAN BACKGROUND CHECK AT LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICE

Clinical Supervisor Interns (CSI) can practice as a clinical supervisor under the supervision of a certified clinical supervisor.

The CSI will have up to 3 years to complete the requirements for full certification.

SUPERVISION RATIO

The CSI-Intern is supervised by a CSI at 1:80 hours.



2. FULL CERTIFICATION

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

THE "3 E'S" OF CERTIFICATION

EXPERIENCE

4,000 Hours (2 years) of supervised clinical supervisory experience verified by CSI

EDUCATION

Completion of remaining 15 hours (total of 30 hours) of clinical supervisory specific education/training

EXAM

Passing Score on the IC&RC CS Examination

ANNUAL PROGRESS & PERFORMANCE REPORT

The supervisory CSI is required to update the Board annually of the progress and performance of the CSI.

REFERENCE REQUIREMENTS

You must also acquire three references, including one from a supervisee.
