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On August 8, 2012, the Ethics Committee of the North Carolina Substance Abuse Professionals Practice Board considered the grievance filed against you by Rodney Harris, an employee of Phoenix Counseling.

Pursuant to the statutory authority provided the Board, the Ethics Committee conducted a meeting for the purpose of seeking an informal resolution. After considering the information available to it, the Ethics Committee found the Complaint was "with merit."

The rules provide that if after a finding of "with merit" to the Complaint, the Ethics Committee may determine that a hearing before the Board is not required and the Ethics Committee may issue various levels of discipline depending upon the misconduct, the actual or potential injury caused, and any aggravating or mitigating factors. The Ethics Committee may issue an Admonition, Reprimand, or Censure to the Respondent Substance Abuse Professional.

A Reprimand is a written form of discipline more serious than an Admonition issued in cases in which a Substance Abuse Professional has violated one or more provisions of the Rules of Ethics and has caused harm or potential harm to a client; the field or substance abuse prevention, intervention and treatment; the profession; or a member of the public; but the misconduct does not require a Censure.

The Ethics Committee Chair was of the opinion that a Censure is not required in this case and issues this Reprimand to you. As Chairperson of the Ethics Committee of the North Carolina Substance Abuse Professional Practice Board, it is now my duty to issue this Reprimand and I am certain that you will understand fully the spirit in which this duty is performed.

This Reprimand is based on your possession of confidential files that were not redacted, from one agency while working at another agency. You were also found not to be in possession of authorizations of release, nor were these files stored properly.

You are hereby reprimanded by the North Carolina Substance Abuse Professional Practice Board due to your professional misconduct. The Ethics Committee trusts that you will heed this Reprimand, that it will be remembered by you, that it will be beneficial to you, and that you will never again allow yourself to depart from adherence to the high ethical standards of the profession.
